

# Where to go and What to do



## Z-1: Polígono Central



“The Polígono Central” is at the heart of dining, shopping and nightlife in Santo Domingo. There are an estimated 200 restaurants in this zone with plenty of nightspots and shopping.

## Z-2: Av. 27 de Febrero



“La 27” is the city’s central artery dotted with smaller boutiques and three large plazas. This strip is home to many banks, salons, gyms and cell phone offices.

## Z-3: Zona Colonial and Duarte



“La Zona Colonial” is a one stop location for souvenirs, restaurants and nightlife; all within walking distance of one another. “La Duarte” has a feel of its own. If you can’t find it on Duarte, you can’t find it anywhere.

## Z-4: Gazcue



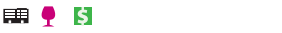
